
- I found the textbook to be very clear and not too wordy which helped a lot for my comprehension. I also
  appreciate having the in person discussion component as I know that the course was originally described as
  fully online but I think the weekly zoom class discussions were very helpful but could be longer maybe 1h20
  instead of 50 mins. I also appreciate the notes that you posted before every class session each week.
- I think the discussions in the zoom lectures were interesting and relative to what was being expressed within the book.
- The weekly discussions were very impactful. The weekly note packets sent out by the professor were very helpful in guiding the students to the most important ideas in the chapters. The thoughtful questions posed in these weekly packets made for a meaningful discussion in class. Additionally, the discussion boards were also very thought-provoking. I enjoyed thinking about the topics posed in the prompts and then sharing opinions. It was a great way to connect with other students in an online setting. The weekly journals and lengthy comments made by professor did help with understanding how to effectively argue and articulate your points. However, I think it could be even better if there were prompts to. answer for the weekly journals. Instead of a free response, if a question was posed the student could then more easily answer the prompt. That way, it would be a more standardized way to. grade a person based on the argument they make. A weekly journal makes sense because it allows for the students to actually engage personally with and reflect on each chapter read.

- Exploring how the justice system operates has been intriguing throughout the entire class, though the most beneficial aspect is probably getting more knowledgeable about our rights in this system as well as finding some helpful law websites.
- I was able to really think through a situation and see views from different perspectives.
- I really liked that the class was split up so for the zoom sessions as it made it much easier to be a part of the class discussions.
- The fact that the class format was a guided discussion facilitated learning through asking questions. That also
  made participating easy, and encouraged preparedness in order to be able to engage with the class.
- I believe the most beneficial aspects was the questions for the readings and class. The questions made sure I
  understood what the reading was about and when discussing them in class, I was able to hear about different
  perspectives.
- I do think that the journals were the most beneficial part of the course, where we could describe what we had learned and what we had struggled with in the course that week.


- I think that having to speak 5 times in a 50 minute session was a lot to ask. The question was mostly Q&A which means that the professor spoke a lot of the time responding to comments and answering questions so despite splitting the course into 2 class sessions, it's still almost impossible to expect that every student would be able to speak 5 times, in my opinion. I also think it would be better for the weekly discussion board to be open-ended and not have a prompt, that way those who didn't get to speak 5 times in class but maybe had something to say could post it there. Lastly, I do think that the weekly journals were a bit much. Doing biweekly journals might be better, I think. Also, I would suggest making the word limit more like 400 because I found it really difficult to write something that's clear/precise and makes an argument and also cites reading material as background in just 300 words.
- I am the type of student that learns from slides and more of a lecture type setting rather than discussion. I
   believe that discussion is important, but I felt as though I did not truly grasp an understanding of the material.
- The textbook was a good source for explaining the broad topics and intricacies of law and jurisprudence. However, the reading was not as compelling as the discussions we had in class. I would suggest supplementing the weekly textbook reading with a contemporary article about how the topics discussed in the book actually play out in real life. This would help students engage with the text in a more meaningful way. Additionally, the grading system could be more clearly laid out in the syllabus. It was confusing when a. few weeks in the participation system changed. I was surprised when I saw the participation score, since I thought it would be higher. By clearly outlining the ways you can gain participation points in the syllabus (and if it changes later on, send out an updated version of the syllabus), students will have a better understanding of the ways they can participate.
