


II Survey Overview: Course Section Results Aggregate

In addition, I think this course should put more emphasis on going through the argument analysis process in the classroom as well as the cues we should be looking for when examining such arguments as I think that would have made these projects less stressful and ultimately boosting student performance on them.

- I have a lot that can be done: 1. Stop giving reading quizzes. They do not motivate me to read, in fact, they do the complete opposite. I spend time fishing out potential test questions rather than absorbing material. 2. Stop with the article analyses. They are too formulaic and result in confusion. I would get comments back and not even know what they meant. Having us write our own analyses would have been better. 3. Participation being such a huge part of the class feels strange. The material is not the most interesting and the professor can sometimes have a cold demeanor. It leads to awkwardness.
- Make the quizzes easier.
- The professor grades participation, but she talks for the majority of the class. Especially at the start and end of the term, class participation went down. At the start, I noticed MANY students with their hands up and slowly started to put them down as they realized that the professor's comments were rather lengthy. The lengthy comments discourage a lot of students from even trying to participate, as only a few students get to contribute to the discussion, and it's because they are stubborn enough to keep their hands raised. For this professor, I would suggest lowering the requirement of participation or allowing the students to lead the conversation rather than the professor. During the last class, I watched as only one student and the professor had a one-on-one conversation the entire time. I gave up trying to participate, even though I hadn't gone through all my required participation tags.
